The charity provides a range of assistance, support and education services for young people aged two to 19, as well as adults and their families. Services include:

- Langside School a specialist day school for children with profound and multiple disabilities
- Childrens' respite projects including overnight breaks to offer respite and help
  families manage the challenges of providing full time care for their child, home support
  (domiciliary care) for children and young people, and holiday and after-school activities
  that give young people with disabilities the same leisure and fun opportunities that their
  peers enjoy. Fun activities for their siblings and parent support groups are also provided
- **Support for adults** a well equipped day centre, (add comma) where adults can learn new skills and enjoy a wide range of experiences, (add comma) and a supported living service which helps adults live independently in their own home with 24/7 support.
- Advice provides assistance with disability benefits for people with disabilities and their families or carers, as well as the parents of disabled children.
